


A Prayer for Good Friday

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During this service, it is common to encounter a number of intense emotions such as anger, sadness, disbelief, and compassion. Such feelings will arise as we contemplate the way Jesus was treated. It's not an easy path, but it is the path we choose to take in order to deeply reflect on Jesus' sacrifice.

For a more contemplative and meaningful experience, you may wish to consider the following reflective questions and/or prayer prompts. Part of the intent behind this service is to deeply engage the themes of darkness, sacrificial love, and redemption that run throughout the Passion of Jesus Christ.

Reflective Questions to Consider:

- 1. What does the increasing darkness of the Tenebrae service symbolize for you personally?
- 2. How does the story of Christ's passion and death challenge or comfort you in your current circumstances?
- 3. In what ways can we identify with the feelings of loss and abandonment expressed in the Tenebrae readings?

Prayer Prompts to Consider:

- 1. Pray for the grace to understand the depth of Christ's sacrifice and the breadth of his love for humankind.
- 2. Offer prayers of repentance, acknowledging the ways in which we fall short and our need for God's mercy.
- 3. Pray for those who feel abandoned or are suffering, that they may find comfort and hope in the message of the cross.
